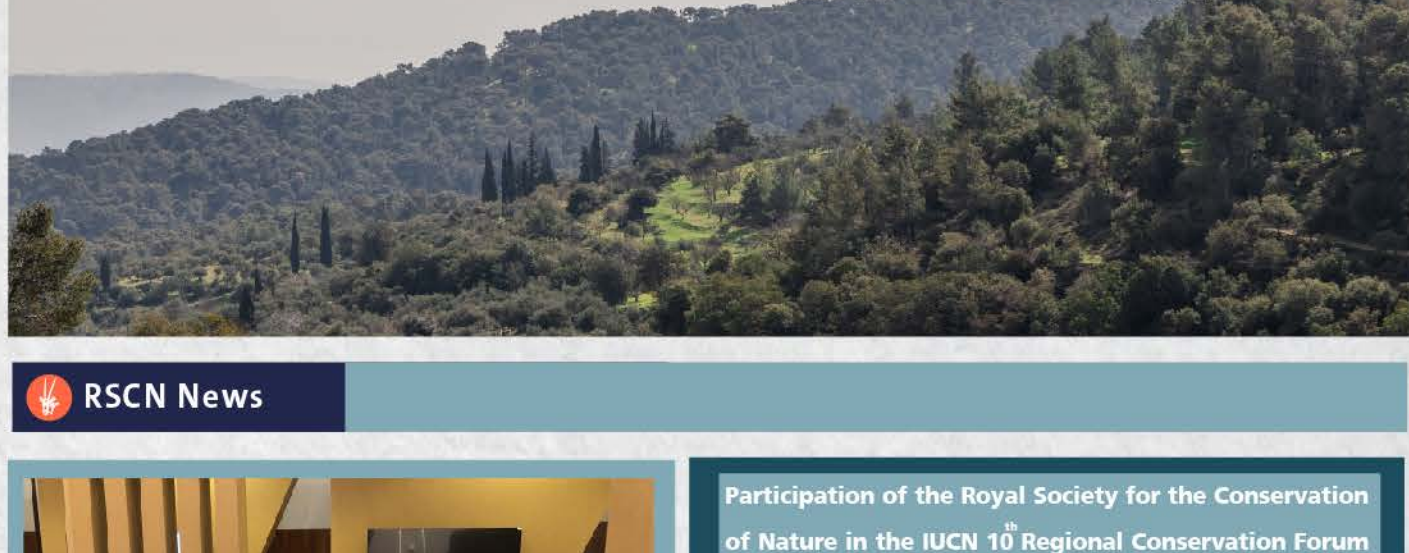
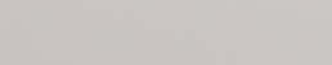

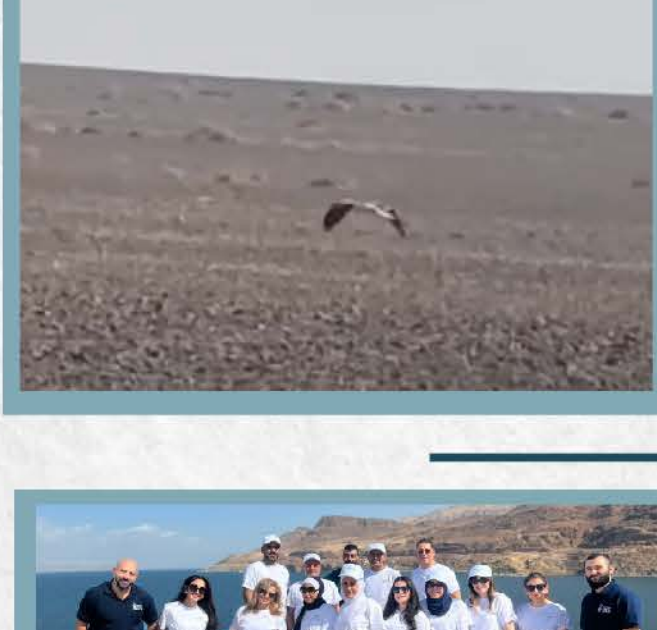


Issuing Hunting Licenses Electronically is a New Service Provided by the Royal Society For The Conservation of Nature

Observations of the Endangered Egyptian vulture (Neophron Percnapterus) Globally in the Eastern Desert Regions

During the inspection tours conducted by the conservation and hunting regulation inspectors of the Royal Society for the Conservation of Nature, sightings of the Egyptian vulture (Neophron Percnapterus), which is globally endangered, were recorded in the eastern desert areas. The Egyptian vulture is one of the smallest and rarest vulture species in Europe and the Middle East, and it is globally threatened with extinction.

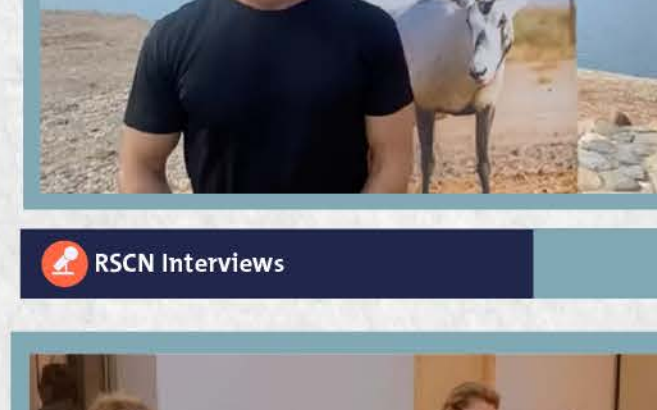


In Celebration of World Clean-up Day: RSCN Organizes the "Clean-up the World" Event in Mujib Biosphere Reserve

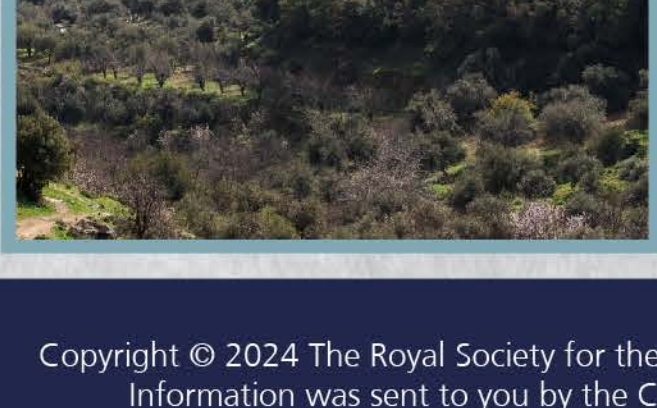
Blinks' Platform Shows How Amazing The Royal Society For Conservation Of Nature's "Ostrich Egg Dotting" Workshop

Biodiversity



The Dibeen Forest Reserve's significance.

Dibeen Forest Reserve is one of the best examples of Aleppo pine forests, as it is the last extension of these forests at the southern level oriental in the world. It also hosts at least 17 endangered species locally, such as the Persian squirrel. The reserve is in the middle of the forest and the tree species are distributed according to the level of the forest height. In the low-lying area there is densely Aleppo pine. In the middle zone there are oaks and pine. Also, in the upper level of the forest abounds oak evergreen. Other tree species such as maple, duck and wild olive trees are also common, and the protected area represents a pattern of Aleppo pine forests.
