








Celebrating Excellence: Three Jubilee Silver Medals Recognize the Royal Society for the Conservation of Nature's Commitment to Environmental Stewardship and Community Empowerment In a landmark event for environmental protection and nature reserves in Jordan, the Royal Society for the Conservation of

Nature received three Jubilee Silver Medals during the royal visits of His Majesty King Abdullah II and His Royal Highness Crown Prince Hussein bin Abdullah II to various governorates, celebrating the Kingdom's Jubilee Silver Anniversary of King Abdullah II's reign.

This royal recognition is a badge of honor for the Society and a testament to its ongoing efforts to preserve biodiversity, develop nature reserves, and provide sustainable income and job opportunities for local communities surrounding these reserves. The award of two medals for Ajloun Forest Reserve and one medal for Dana Biosphere Reserve highlights the society's prominent position in the environmental arena at both the national and regional levels.

The Environmental Importance of Dana **Biosphere Reserve** According to UNESCO classification, Dana Biosphere Reserve, established in 1989, is considered the largest and first biosphere reserve in Jordan. It is one of the most important reserves in the Arab world due to its enormous biodiversity, including Jordan's

last known natural gathering of cypress. The reserve also hosts a rare collection of native plant species, totaling of 891 different types. Additionally, Dana Reserve serves as a natural genetic bank for various wildlife species, earning it global recognition, particularly in research and studies. Its significance lies in the presence of several distinct environments within a single reserve, including the mountainous Tafila Mountains, the steppe, and the
